The script service provides a method for running web scripts using an Athena account. Anyone at MIT with an account or a locker can fully use this service. Whether you're just getting started or are an experienced programmer, *scripts.mit.edu* can help you deploy a dynamic website easily and effectively.

Here's a sample of what the service provides:

## Quick-installers for common software:

- Wikis (Mediawiki, etc)
- Blogs (WordPress, etc)
- Content Management Systems
- Photo Galleries
- Message Boards and Forums
- Polls, calendars, etc.

## Features for flexible development:

- CGI script support (perl, php, python, ruby, scheme, etc)
- MySQL database access
- Scheduled jobs (cron)
- Advanced email processing
- Short URL support (eg: mygroup.mit.edu)

For example, installing a web-accessible wiki only requires you to run two commands on Athena and answer a few basic questions:
