Computing

All Institute attendees have accounts on the MIT Computing Environment, known as Athena. Your athena account gives you an email address (YOUR_USERNAME@mit.edu) and 250Mb of storage. You will be able to check email, browse the web, and print. Athena workstations are distributed about campus in clusters. Each Athena cluster has its own dedicated laser printers. The Athena clusters are open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Each cluster is in a locked room, accessible by entering a combination into a keypad lock. Please e-mail lsa-2005@mit.edu for the combination. Cluster locations and information on the type of equipment at each cluster is on the next page.

Those who bring laptops with wireless cards will be able to access the internet through MIT's wireless network. A one-time web-based registration is all that's required. You will need to be on campus to register. Wireless access is available on most of the campus; the Stata Center, where most of the classes will be held, has complete coverage. A map of wireless coverage on campus is available at http://web.mit.edu/network/wireless-map.html. Printing facilities are also available at the CopyTech centers on campus; printing will cost a small fee per page.

For participants who are taking courses that use the computer classroom, there will be 24 hour access to the computer classroom to work on class projects. These computers are for class projects only.



Libraries

MIT

The MIT Libraries support the Institute's programs of study and research. There are five major subject libraries for Architecture and Planning, Engineering, Humanities, Science, Management and Social Science, as well as five specialized libraries and the Institute Archives, that offer access to a wide range of materials, both print and electronic. The Library collection includes more than 2.6 million printed volumes, 17,000 current journal subscriptions, 275 online databases, and over 3800 electronic journal titles licensed for access on the Institute's network.

The Linguistics Collection is housed in the Humanities Library, 14S-200. The collection strengths include: theoretical linguistics, indigenous languages from North America and the Pacific, creole studies and computational linguistics. If you visit the collection, please be aware that approximately 45% of the book collection is in storage and our electronic collection, available through http://libraries.mit.edu/vera is extensive. The current and bound journals and the MIT dissertations collections are all in the Humanities Library. Please contact Theresa A. Tobin (tat@mit.edu) if you need assistance with the library or the collection.

Faculty, Affiliates and Participants:

You will receive MIT library privileges while attending the LSA Institute. You must present you LSA ID Card and a picture ID when borrowing materials.

Harvard

The Harry Elkins Widener Memorial Library is Harvard University's flagship library. It has over 65 miles of shelves and the capacity to hold over three million volumes.

Faculty:

Faculty of the Institute may be issued ID cards by the Harvard University ID Office for the Summer School Program. These cards will provide access to the library and borrowing privileges at Widener Library. If an ID card is not issued, individuals may apply in person for a special borrower's card, at no fee, at the Library Privileges Office, Widener Library Room 135. Individuals should present a photo ID at time of application.

Participants and Affiliates:

Institute participants are eligible for Stacks Browsing and Reading Room Privileges at the Widener Library upon request at the Library Privileges Office. Individuals should present a photo ID at time of application. This pass will allow access to Widener Library, browsing access to the Stacks and use of the reference collection in the Loker Reading Room, the current periodicals collection in the Periodicals Reading Room and the newspapers on microfilm in the Newspaper Microfilm Reading Room. In addition, individuals may request

up to ten items per day to be paged from the Harvard Depository (HD) to be delivered for their use in the Phillips Reading Room. HD materials are delivered after 3pm the next business day after requests are made.

The Library Privileges office hours are: Monday-Friday from 9am – 4:45pm.

MITAC

MITAC is a non-profit employee service that serves the cultural and recreational needs of the MIT Community by offering dozens of events and trips annually.
